

Brief Report :-

World Standards Day was celebrated on 14-10-2023 by organizing a webinar on google meet. In absence of Er. M.L. Jain, Chairman, Meerut Local Centre, Er. Rajneesh Kumar, immediate Past Chairman welcomed the guests. The theme of the day was "The Shared Vision for a Better World" Er. Hariom Meena, scientist B and Assistant Director (BIS), Ghaziabad was the keynote speaker. The speaker said that sustainable development is an organizing principle for meeting human development goals while simultaneously sustaining the ability of natural system to provide the natural resources and ecosystem services on which the economy society depends. He said that United Nations through a resolution identified a collection of 17 global goals which shall serve as a blue print to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all and which nations must strive to achieve by the year 2030. While each SDG is broad and comprehensive, these are not independent goals but are rather interlinked with one another. He further said that ISO at the global level and BIS at the national level are leading the transformation by ivolving and aligning themselves with the SDG by setting about medium and long term strategies for tying drivers of this transformation, but also expects that we as individuals to come up with innovative ideas to implement the concept of "The Shared Vision for a Better World". The leading international standards setting bodies such as ISO, IEC and ITO have been striving to work towards formulating standards following the best practices of standardization,

making standards as widely acceptable as possible. He underlined the role of Bureau of Indian Standards in achieving SDGs. BIS too, has been endeavouring to achieve the SDGs through rolling out need based standards for the society. BIS has been formulating indigenous standards, in diverse sectors like food and agriculture, environment, information technology, power distribution systems and medical devices etc. He explained how standards can help achieving each of 17 SDGs.
